## Civic Centre reinvention to revitalise Esher High Street

### Progress report on Esher Vision 2030

At last month's Esher Chamber of Commerce meeting, ERA councillor and Deputy Leader of EBC, Simon Waugh and Tim Oliver, Surrey County Council's leader, gave an upbeat report on the Esher Vision for 2030.

**Very significantly, Simon and Tim are working together to improve Esher's town centre and to improve life in Lower Green.**

Simon said there is placemaking work underway across the whole borough, but Esher has moved up the hierarchy.

Options for redeveloping the Civic Centre have been a catalyst for a full scale review of the town centre. This evolving vision has been driven by the public consultations carried out earlier this year.

It has been clear for a long time that Esher's town centre lacks a compelling reason for people to visit it. The traffic layout, congestion and pollution make it an unfriendly place to be.

Elmbridge Borough Council wants to create a reinvigorated Esher town centre where, during the day, people will come to 'the Civic Heart of the Borough.'

It plans to attract a variety of businesses into the area offering employment opportunities and driving footfall to independent, creative shops, cafes and new public spaces.

There will be new space for community events and farmers' markets and our impressive, but inaccessible monuments will be moved, contributing to a new public realm.

At night, the restaurants, theatre and cinema will continue to draw visitors from across the borough.

As well as making Esher a destination, rather than a town through which people pass, the proposals will encourage sustainable living, improving access to better quality green spaces and high quality, safe spaces for children to play. The team working on this new vision also proposes a diversity of housing in improved settings on the High Street itself.

Since there is an urgent need for more sustainable travel, the proposals will mean increased safety for pedestrians, cyclists and other road users.

# Esher Vision 2030 Progress Report

## CHANGE ESHER

JOIN THE DEBATE

**Tim Oliver lives in Esher and, like all of us, struggles with the road layout. He reiterated the value of the new Vision 2030 and said it reflects Surrey County Council's desire that 'nobody is left behind'.**

Across the county he is addressing health inequalities. Extraordinarily, there is a 10 year difference in life expectancy between Oxshott and Leatherhead, and Surrey is placing great focus on addressing this through public health initiatives, encouraging people to walk and cycle. Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plans (LCWIPs) will be implemented in all parts of the county with one of the benefits being safe routes around schools.

Tim spoke of a greener future. 46% of carbon emissions come from vehicles and we need to get people out of their cars and into much more robust public transport. Interestingly, Surrey County Council has piloted, in Mole Valley, an 'on demand' electric mini bus service and Tim confirmed that this will be rolled out across the whole county in 2024 including here in

Elmbridge. He is very supportive of the work that Simon and the Borough Council are doing and will be working with the Borough Council to secure funding to deliver the vision. He is also committed to working with Simon to examine the closure of some of the slip roads to encourage a more relaxed, outdoor café environment.

Lower Green is a separate piece of work which Simon has led for some time. Again, the team is working with Surrey County Council to look at our wider land holdings to see if it is possible to include more housing and move some of the more industrial facilities around the borough.

Expect plans early next year.

This all sounds great. **What's next?**

The team is commissioning a Stage 1 feasibility study to look at options for the public realm enhancements and working with Surrey County Council to assess the deliverability of highway improvements.

They will continue to engage with our businesses and residents as work progresses.

## Dominic Raab picks up our campaign

Many of you will have received a letter from our MP, Dominic Raab, referencing a survey of residents' opinions concerning the impact of traffic through Esher.

We are delighted that he is such an avid reader of our newsletters and that Simon Smith's article in our last edition No105 (still available at <https://esher-residents.com/newsletters/>) has prompted him into action.

Simon has been writing to Dominic since 2019 about this subject, but has enjoyed limited success, indeed the last response from Dominic's caseworker in February 2021 reads:

*"Given Highways England's reply to you of February last year (which I have re-read) it's unlikely at this point that we would be able to get anything more productive from them at this point – however, I know from dialogue with Surrey County Council (who is responsible for the county's highways) that they are investing heavily in other forms of travel provision such as cycling lanes. This is with the specific view to get more people out from their cars".*

**While we rejoice at the Damascene conversion, years have been wasted with little or no action on this matter from those in national government and we respectfully request that whoever is our MP, following the next General Election, will pursue this matter with some vigour. We welcome your thoughts on this matter.**

touching lives

Cllr. Richard Williams has chosen Oasis to be his Mayoral Charity for 2023/4. "It does the most remarkable work with families who are struggling and I'm keen to raise as much money as I can for them" he says. Indeed, he's so committed to fund raising for them that he's recently signed up to making a sponsored skydive. He's set the target at £5,000 but would love to raise more.

"Being vulnerable is not limited to a particular social class. Financial hardship, abuse, addiction and poor physical and mental health can affect anyone at anytime," he continues, "and children are often the ones most affected by these issues. Oasis works hard to safeguard them and ensure they are in loving family environments".

Each family is different and, over time, their needs change, but Oasis sets no time limit on the support it offers, giving assistance for as long as it's required.

The team also provides outreach services to families. A holistic plan is put in place to make improvements in peoples' daily lives. Early preventative work helps families avoid falling into crisis and circumvents involvement with the police and social services. However, should a crisis arise, support is offered.

Emotional wellbeing support is given through counselling and family members have access to various courses including the Freedom Programme for survivors of domestic abuse, life coaching, art therapy, 1-to-1 parenting and special education needs support. Guidance on healthy eating and family nutrition is also offered.

Oasis is able to signpost families to services they themselves cannot provide such as addiction services and housing organisations and is able to advocate on behalf of families to these services when they lack the confidence to contact them and/or distrust them.

Alongside this, Oasis provides a legal surgery for questions relating to family law, it provides emergency services including clothing, fuel bursaries and fresh food banks and holds an annual Christmas appeal to support families in numerous ways at what can be a very difficult time of year for many.

# Our Amnesty garden and the story behind it

In 1963 a state of emergency was declared in Syria. When President Hafez al-Assad, father of the present President assumed power in 1970, freedom of speech was curtailed, and human rights abuses proliferated. Security forces loyal to al-Assad arbitrarily arrested 'political' suspects and had the power to hold them indefinitely.

In 1983, while studying Physics at Damascus University, Syrian student Nabil Julaq was arrested for supporting the removal of the state of emergency and his request for democratic elections. Amnesty International UK invited Esher & District's Amnesty Group to adopt Nabil as their 'prisoner of conscience'. From 1986 to 1995 the group worked tirelessly to draw the Syrian authorities' attention to his case.

On 16<sup>th</sup> April 1988, the Esher & District Amnesty Group organised the planting of damask roses to commemorate Nabil's five year incarceration. Mayor of Elmbridge, Councillor Ruth Lyon planted the roses and a memorial plaque was erected in Church Walk, Esher. The event coincided with the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Declaration of Human Rights.

The group continued to write to Nabil in prison until his eventual release in 1995, 11 years after his arrest. During that time, he had been held without charge or trial.


A 'released' plaque was then added to the rose bed by Ruth Lyon. The group had further success in 1995 with their next prisoner of conscience, the Tunisian journalist Mohamed

Kilani. Following a campaign, where more than 100 letters were sent by people from Esher, Kilani was granted a presidential pardon that same year.

On his release, Kilani thanked the group.



Another Esher Amnesty Group memorial residents may find of interest, is the olive tree in the Recreation Ground opposite the Princess Alice Hospice. This was planted on Human Rights Day in 2011 by MP Dominic Raab to celebrate 50 years since the foundation of Amnesty International.

The Esher & District Amnesty group is still active, nearly 50 years since its formation. The mission of the group has not changed and they continue to take action, online or offline, to support refugees and other human rights causes and petition governments for the release of individuals at risk. The group is not political and bases its work on the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.
